NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF THE PROPOSED CLASS ACTION – RESTRICTION OF CLASS ACTION TO QUÉBEC

Who is concerned by this notice?

You are concerned by this notice if you are an Indigenous person subject to the *Indian Act* and you attended a provincial Indigenous day school located in an Indigenous community <u>outside of the province of Québec.</u>

Modification of the Proposed Class Action

Mr. James Jonah has sought permission from the Superior Court of Québec to bring a class action against the Government of Canada on behalf of all persons who attended a provincial Indigenous day school.

While Mr. Jonah initially proposed that the class action cover all of Canada, he has since decided to seek to pursue a class action <u>only on behalf of persons who attended a</u> <u>provincial Indigenous day school in the province of Québec</u>.

The Superior Court of Québec has authorized Mr. Jonah to modify the proposed class action, in order to restrict it to the province of Québec. The Court's decision is available on Mr. Jonah's lawyers' websites:

This modification of the proposed class action means that if you attended a provincial Indigenous day school outside of Québec, <u>you will not be a part of this class action</u>. However, the modification of the proposed class action does not extinguish any legal rights you may have. If you are affected by this notice and believe you have a legal claim related to your attendance of a provincial Indigenous day school outside Québec, you should consult a lawyer promptly (there are time limits in order to bring a lawsuit).
